

English

Week 1: Descriptive writing; *The Great Explorer* by Chris Judge.

Week 2: Non-fiction writing; Polar Animal fact file.

Week 3 and 4: Traditional tales; *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*, *Little Red Riding Hood*.

Retelling and rewriting the story, Wolf Wanted posters.

Week 5: Traditional tales; Use a familiar story to write a new one.

Week 6: Poetry; Linked to the Frozen Planet theme.

Mathematics

We will be: learning our times tables and use these to multiply by 2,3,5 and 10 using arrays, counting on and repeated addition. We will then use our multiplication knowledge to help us solve problems involving division including sharing and equal groups. We will also be looking at the unit Statistics where we will Interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables. Ask and answer simple questions by counting the number of objects in each category and sorting the categories by quantity. Ask and answer questions about totalling and comparing categorical data.

Topic

We will be locating and comparing the UK, The Arctic and Antarctica. We will then explore the different animals that can be found in the Polar regions and how they have adapted to survive.

Alongside this we will learn about Inuits and how they live in cold regions. Children will find out about a famous polar explorer's expedition before learning about changes to the polar environments and how it can be sustained.

Music

This term will focus on a rock song called 'I Wanna Play In A Band'. Children will learn about singing and playing together in an ensemble. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song, children will listen and appraise classic rock songs.

Computing

This term we will be using Scratch, a programming software where children will create a build programmes with different components.

P.E

This term PE will be Gymnastics using Large apparatus with Mr Digby and outdoor Multiskills with Miss Weeks.

RE

This unit is called 'Caring for Others'. Children will learn about kindness and the importance of caring for others, by exploring the values of different religions. This includes reading stories from different faiths and learning about religious festivals and practices

Art

This Lowry unit will teach your class about 19th century painter LS Lowry. The children will have the opportunity to explore the life and work of Lowry and to learn about the industrial landscape that provided the subject of many of his paintings. Each lesson in the unit focuses on improving a key skill in art and design; comparing works of art, colour mixing, perspective, drawing figures, drawing buildings and scissor skills

Science

Our unit is called 'Seasonal Changes (Autumn and Winter)' we will learn about the four seasons, with a particular focus on autumn and winter. We will learn what the word weather means and find out how different types of weather can be measured. Children will use a class weather station to observe, measure and record the weather across the seasons. They will also observe changes across the seasons by exploring the signs of autumn and winter through nature and wildlife. A range of learning activities are used in this unit including observation, discussion and learning outside. Children will also work scientifically by collecting, recording and interpreting simple data.

PSHE

'Going for Goals'

This theme focuses primarily on the key aspect of motivation, with a subsidiary focus on self-awareness. It gives an important opportunity for all children's abilities, qualities and strengths to be valued. The theme provides opportunities for the children to reflect on themselves as individuals, particularly their strengths as learners and how they learn most effectively.
