



Just a few photos from previous summers at Sandhurst. We miss you all so much and can't wait to make more memories soon.

It has been lovely to see some of you this week. Although school is a little different at the moment, the children have taken it in their stride and Mrs Knowler and I are very proud of them.





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## Nightingale Class Update
